de Souza Institute offers 2 special designations, **de Souza Intern**, and **de Souza Scholar.** The **de Souza Intern** designation is ideal for students currently enrolled in nursing programs with an interest in Oncology and/or Hospice Palliative Care. The **de Souza Scholar** designation is ideal for nurses who have a PhD or Post-Doctorate in any health related field, with a focus in oncology or hospice palliative care.

For nursing students with an interest in oncology and/or hospice palliative care.

- Obtain a total of 2.0 course credits, including at least one course from each of the four domains of practice.
- Pass the Foundations in Oncology Nursing Practice (FONP) course.
- Complete one clinical placement in an area of practice that provides cancer or hospice palliative care.
- Enrolled in a nursing program when starting the designation courses. The designation will be awarded upon receiving a valid licence issued by the provincial/ territorial RN regulators in Canada.

For nurse executives, managers, professors or scientists with a PhD or a Post-Doctorate in an oncology or hospice palliative care related field.
